Home-grown school feeding (HGSF)

"The innovative element of HGSF is in supporting smallholder farmers... school feeding programmes that are linked to local agricultural production can create structured and predictable markets for local and smallholder produce, reducing smallholders' uncertainty regarding market engagement and the risks they face in investing in improved and diversified production"





Home-grown school feeding (HGSF) in the Pacific

- Less recognised and utilised in the Pacific
- Challenges include capacity to produce food, remote locations, resourcing
- Opportunities include supporting nutritious diets, boosting educational outcomes, supporting local livelihoods and economies, positive impact on the environment

Through a regional coordinated and multisectoral approach, the PSFN focuses on promoting policy, good practice, and action to foster healthier school food environments.




- provide opportunities for collaboration and networking for those interested in school food activities
- provide opportunities for capacity building for those interested in school food activities
- provide a forum for technical input into school food provision and nutrition education activities
- provide a forum for policy guidance and leadership for healthier school food environments
- provide an avenue for sharing information and resources, including aligning to/supporting regional events (e.g., Pacific Week of Agriculture, regional health/education forums)
- promote research and greater evidence to inform school food policies and activities
- provide a focal point for collaboration with similar global initiatives including the School Meals Coalition
- explore resource mobilisation for research to inform school food activities and implementation to improve Pacific school food environments
- host an inventory/database of pacific school food activities on the PSFN website





Pacific School Food Activity Database






Started: 2020 Status: Ongoing
